In this day and age, there is no room for complacency anymore and procurement departments need to concentrate on the companies that are placing the environment at the heart of their business strategy”.

HVO is a proven alternative to petrol and diesel and the 100% renewable fuel eliminates up to 90% of net carbon dioxide emissions. The O'Donovan fleet also boasts Euro six engines throughout which reduces NOx by 85%. The award winning business has previously announced their aspiration to be carbon neutral by 2035 and this significant move will be a huge contributing factor to achieving this.

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
